~ ~ ~ SUPERINTENDENT’S MESSAGE ~ ~ ~

Welcome back EP Bulldogs! I am tremendously proud and honored to introduce myself as the new Superintendent of East Palestine School District. I want to thank the numerous individuals in the community and on the staff at East Palestine for providing me with such a warm welcome since my arrival on July 1st.

Prior to applying for the position, I researched the district very closely; no stone was left unturned. Report card and trend data were analyzed, the five year forecast was reviewed, members of the community and staff were consulted, and the website was explored. It was when I stumbled upon the mission statement that I knew East Palestine was a place I wanted to be a part of - the *promise* that our staff and the community made to our students: “The mission of the EP School District is to provide an environment where excellence is expected and character nurtured.”

It was at that moment that I knew that EP has a tremendous amount to offer their students.

East Palestine’s mission statement addresses excellence and character. “Excellence” is important for numerous reasons. “Excellence” opens doors. “Excellence” sets individuals and teams apart on the field, in the arts, in the classroom, and in careers. “Excellence” distinguishes between those who possess superior skills or abilities and those who do not. “Excellence” requires passion, hard work, focus, determination, and drive. Vince Lombardi summarized “excellence” when he said, “...a man’s finest hour, the greatest fulfillment of all that he holds dear, is that moment when he has worked his heart out in a good cause and lies exhausted on the field of battle – victorious.” To me, that’s “excellence”.

What made EP’s mission statement different and what solidified my desire to be part of the EP team was that the mission statement also addressed “character”. “Character” is defined as the “mental and moral qualities distinctive to an individual”. “Character” can be lost in pursuit of “excellence” if we focus more on the *what* (excellence) than on the *who* (students/character). “Excellence” and “character” shouldn’t be exclusive of one another; in fact, I believe that excellence is a bi-product of nurtured character. When I read the EP mission statement, it was evident that our staff and our community value the individual, and therefore, we can expect great things to come. Educating our youth requires a team of individuals to work together as we share the enormous responsibility of preparing children for bright futures. The work is incredibly rewarding as we see these youngsters grow and develop into productive, independent individuals who reach their potentials - right before our eyes!

Whether we are parents, students, staff, or community members, we begin each school year with a sense of anticipation, enthusiasm, and optimism for our next generation. I look eagerly toward the upcoming year and working with all stakeholders to uphold our mission.

NEW STUDENTS MUST REGISTER

Students new to the East Palestine City School District must register before classes begin on August 25th. New residents to the district must register students at the individual buildings. New residents should bring the following when registering their children: shot records, certified birth certificate, child's social security card, parent identification (driver license, social security card, or identification from Human Services), proof of residence in the school district, and custody papers if applicable.

STUDENTS ATTENDING NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Parents of children who attend non-public schools are asked to notify the East Palestine Schools of this attendance in writing to Superintendent Traci Hostetler, at 200 West North Ave., East Palestine, Ohio 44413. In order to receive transportation reimbursement, this contact must be made by August 25th.

HOME SCHOOLING NOTIFICATION

Before a student can be released by a public school district and follow a home schooling program, proper notification must be made to the school district. Notification to the East Palestine School District must be made before August 25th. Home schooling information should be provided to the Superintendent's Office at 200 West North Avenue Building, 426-4191.

School Hours:

Doors open at 8:30 a.m. for bus riders and walkers. Breakfast will start at 8:20, students may enter through the doors between the library and cafeteria on West Grant Street. The tardy bell rings and classroom instruction begins promptly at 8:40 a.m. Success for All Reading begins promptly at 8:55 a.m. **Please make every effort to have your child at school on time and prepared for their school day.** Dismissal is at 3:15 p.m. for walkers and 3:20 p.m. for bus riders.

Drop-off/Pick Up

We expect to have a higher number of parents that will drop-off and pick-up their children during the first week of school. Therefore, we ask that you assist us by following the guidelines listed below.

- Kindergarten parents may escort their child to the classroom on the **first day of school.**
- There are school personnel ready to help guide all students to homeroom during the first week of school.
- **School supervision will be provided beginning at 8:30 a.m. Please do not have your children waiting to enter prior to this time.**
- **There is no parking on East Street.** Please turn onto East Street using West Grant Street, drop your children off at the designated door and exit onto North Avenue. If you would like to walk your child to their door, please park on West Grant Street or North Avenue.
- Please provide your child with a note regarding dismissal changes or call the secretary prior to 2:30 p.m. to make arrangements.

K-4 bus students enter through the doors nearest to the office on West Grant St. at 8:30 a.m. At 3:10, students will be dismissed to busing pods. Pods will be dismissed at 3:20 p.m. for the day. If you choose to take your child as a last minute walker, you must report to the office prior to 3:00 p.m. in order for us to accommodate you.

Walkers enter and exit on East St. with K-1 using the doors closest to the Board Offices and 2-4 using the doors closest to the cafeteria. Parents may wait for their child in these areas. Parking in the small lot on East St. is prohibited due to the large volume of student traffic.

Information regarding student placement will be posted on Friday, August 14 on the double doors nearest to the elementary office.

Welcome Back Middle School Bulldogs!

EPMS Staff and Administration are very excited about the upcoming school year. Our building motto: BULLDOG PRIDE IS BUILDING WIDE will be reinforced through our PBIS program again this year. Students will be reminded of the expectations in the classroom and through out the building and these expectations will be rewarded and reinforced throughout the year.

All 5th graders and their parents are invited to attend 5th Grade Orientation on August 19 at 6:00 PM in the HS Auditorium. After a brief meeting with the parents, the students will be able to follow their schedule to locate their classrooms and find their lockers. Students in 6-8th grades are invited to Open House at the middle school the same evening from 6:45 PM- 8:00 PM. Students will be able to pick up their schedules and purchase locks for their lockers.

The school day will begin at 7:25 AM. The tardy bell will ring at 7:32 AM. First period begins at 7:32 AM. Homeroom will be part of 1st period. Students who are tardy not only miss homeroom, but also miss instruction in first period. It is important that all students are on time. Parents are reminded they need to call the school if their son/daughter will be absent (330) 426-9451 and must send in a note when the child returns to school. On the first day of school, students will receive handbooks with all of the schools rules. Parents are asked to review these rules with their son/daughter.

The middle school schedule will once again be an 8 period day with the 5th graders eating lunch at 11:03 AM, 6th graders eating at 11:27 AM, 7th graders eating at 11:54 AM and the 8th graders eating at 12:18 PM. The 5th and 6th graders will have a recess period opposite their lunch and the 7th and 8th graders will have a study hall opposite their lunch. A new program this year will allow 8th graders to apply to be a part of an Electronic Yearbook during the lunch/studyhall time in 6th period. More information will be sent home later.

The 8th graders will begin their year with their Chromebooks and the One to World journey will begin. Teachers will utilize online programs to make the lesson accessible for students outside of the classroom. A parent meeting will be held to explain the program and answer parent questions. All 8th graders will be issued a school lock with their Chromebooks.

Parents and students are reminded that the school is not responsible for lost or stolen cell phones and/or electronic devices. Students are not allowed to use cell phones to make phone calls or face time, send texts or post on Twitter or Facebook during the school day unless it is a part of instruction in the classroom. Students who need to contact their parents are required to do so from the office. Parents are asked not to text or call students during the school day. Students using their phones without permission risk having their phones taken from them. Students who refuse to hand over their phones will face disciplinary actions.
